Stephen Cornford uses blank mastering lacquers by amplifying and resonating the rotating platter, producing a palette of surface noise and feedback. Microdeform, AKA Liam McConaghy, collages fragments of environmental recordings, thrift-store vinyl and instrumental improvisation.

Adapted from Jim Thompson's novel by Walter Hill and starring Steve McQueen, this is one of 1970s Hollywood's most stylish thrillers, and a perfect entry point into Peckinpah's nihilistic cinematic world.

The more he bottles up his frustrations with life, the funnier and more dangerous his sleepwalking episodes become. It's preceded by performances from six great stand-up comedians including Jesse Young, George Rigden and Imogen Palmer.

Like David O Russell's previous films, it defies genre, hinging on raw emotion and life-and-death stakes.

Vancouver-based electronic/ambient wizard Scott Morgan, AKA Loscil, is a labelmate of such luminaries as Grouper, Labradford, Tim Hecker and Chameleons. New York, 1962: the downtown folk scene. Solo singers, duos and trios are playing the Gaslight and cutting and releasing records – and the talented, abrasive Llewyn Davis (Oscar Isaac) is getting beaten in the back alley... again. Joel and Ethan Coen's wryly funny story features a terrific array of larger-than-life characters and a glorious score of folk standards.

Shot in black and white and traversing four states, Nebraska is a moving, laugh-out-loud-funny story of family life in America's heartland.
